How do I decide which computer to buy?

Answer:

The most important thing to consider when trying to decide which computer to buy is **WHAT YOU DO ON/OR WITH YOUR COMPUTER.**

If you only check your email and browse the internet, buy the cheapest system you can find. Choose more for comfort than for components.

If you are using it for business purposes, stay away from Celeron and Sempron Processors.

If you take a lot of pictures, do videos or other multimedia, you will need a system that has a large hard drive, a considerable amount of ram, and a good processor. The bottom of the line system will not be sufficient.

If you are buying a computer for your children, consider buying a used or refurbished system. Even your hand-me-down is great. Stay away from buying laptops for your children, unless you have a lot of money to throw away and have a good parent control installed.

If you travel a lot or want to be able to take your computer with you, a laptop is an excellent choice. Screen size, weight, and keyboard size need to be considered seriously. If you carry it with you a lot, you will want it to be light weight. If you are using it as a replacement to a PC, you will want a nice size screen. If you are used to a desktop, you will want a full size keyboard.
